ATT TEAS EXAM	
	Applicants are limited to three attempts within an academic year (September 1- August 31), regardless of the testing site and program to which they are applying.
	Minimum required scores for ATI TEAS: Reading = 69%, Math = 70%, Science = 50%, and English = no minimum
	EXEMPTION: Applicants who have earned a Bachelor of Science Degree from an academic institution accredited by a regional or national accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education, AND have completed both Anatomy & Physiology 1 and 2 with a "C" grade or better within the last 10 years will have the TEAS requirement waived.
